

Policy Regarding Dogs

1. You must inform the hotel of your dog's presence at the time of booking.
2. Only one dog is allowed per room. No size restrictions*.
3. An additional charge of \$60 per night will be applied for your dog's presence.
4. Your dog must not be left alone in the room at any time.
5. You must keep your dog on a leash in the hotel's common areas and at all times when moving around.
6. You are responsible for your dog's behavior and must ensure it does not cause any nuisance to other guests, other dogs, and the establishment's property. Any dog considered detrimental by the hotel cannot be kept in the room. A dog is considered detrimental if it barks or howls constantly at any hour of the day or night, or if it proves to be threatening towards guests or hotel employees.
7. You must immediately clean up after your dog, whether in your room or in the hotel's common areas, and dispose of the waste in a designated area for this purpose.
8. The hotel may lend you equipment such as beds, bowls, and other accessories.
9. The hotel may require a refundable deposit to cover any potential damages caused by your dog.
10. The hotel reserves the right to charge the owner for the cost of any damage caused by their dog.
11. Dogs are not allowed in the following areas: the swimming pool, restaurants (except on the terrace of the Kóz bistro, subject to availability), and the hotel's indoor common spaces. The restaurant reserves the right to refuse the animal if the designated spaces are not available. Only travels from the room to the outside are allowed. This restriction does not apply to guide dogs.
12. You must contact the front desk to inform them of the time you will leave the room with your dog for housekeeping services, if desired.

*The presence of pitbull-type dogs is unfortunately not allowed at Versō hotel. This restriction is due to our sharing of spaces and facilities with the Le Littoral condos, obliging us to adhere to the regulations established by the condominium association for the entire estate.
